Andrew Varney joined the Royal Marines in 1986, aged 17. Throughout an accomplished 24 year career, he served the majority of his time within 45 Commando RM and 3 Commando Brigade and on operations in Northern Ireland, Sierra Leone, Iraq and Afghanistan. He also served with the Royal Marines Reserve and on foreign service with the British Military Advisory Team in Central and Eastern Europe, Central Asia and the Caucasus, specialising in Georgia.

Qualifying in 2008 as a commercial aeroplane pilot, on leaving the military, he initially worked for a short period as a Bush Pilot in Uganda then as a Flight Instructor at his home aerodrome at Dundee, Scotland. On entering the maritime security sector he served his commercial apprenticeship as a strategic Project Manager for a large maritime and offshore security risk management company before founding Port2Port Maritime in late 2011.

Formerly the CEO of Port2Port Group and now Managing Director of the P2P Risk he has overarching responsibility for all areas of company performance with emphasis on capability, compliance, continuity and governance. Blending his extensive military service with considerable industry knowledge, he provides the strategic vision for growth within security risk management sector.
