



Comprehensive Analysis of Economic Costs and Human Costs

- Economic costs focus on firstorder costs
- Conservative estimates
 Human costs focus on impact of attacks on seafarers
- Injuries may be physical or psychological



INTRODUCTION



- Violent acts of piracy down globally
- Small surge in high-profile incidents in East Africa in Q1
- Gulf of Guinea continues to be area of concern
- Kidnap-for-ransom significantly down in Asia
- Increases from 2016 to 2017 in robbery/armed robbery at sea incidents in Latin America and the Caribbean
















ECONOMIC COST OF SOMALI PIRACY (2010-2017)

SEAFARERS EXPOSED TO PIRACY/ROBBERY BY INCIDENT TYPE (2017)








TOTAL INCIDENTS OF PIRACY/ROBBERY (2015 - 2017)



















ECONOMIC COST OF PIRACY IN WEST AFRICA (2015-2017)











SEAFARERS EXPOSED TO PIRACY/ROBBERY BY INCIDENT TYPE (2017)












TOTAL INCIDENTS OF PIRACY/ROBBERY (2014 - 2017)




